A Note from Bettina...

The Spring Workshops at Covenant Presbyterian Church in Sherman and at Oak Cliff Presbyterian Church in Dallas are over

and were attended by 135 Presbyterian Women. We were thrilled by the attendance and by the variety of churches that responded to our invitation. Nor'Kirk Presbyterian Church sent eight women to Sherman who were interested in starting a PW in their church! We were overwhelmed and blessed to meet them! Covenant PW had twenty members attend as well as visitors from Bridgeport, Denton, Denison, Flower Mound, and East Minster in Dallas. These were Presbyterian Women that we were interested in reaching who might not have attended a spring meeting in the past. Oak Cliff Presbyterian Church attracted a very large contingent from Garland as well as 24 members from their own church. PW Women from Preston Hollow, St. Luke, FPC Fort Worth, Commerce, Mabank, and Weatherford, also attended. Both of the host churches worked hard to provide a lovely meal in a beautiful setting after visitors attended various workshops and browsed mission tables.

One of the highlights of the workshops was the commissioning of USA Mission Experience delegate Julie Launey from First Presbyterian in Tyler. She will be traveling with nineteen other PW delegates to New York to learn about women important in the abolitionist movement, the suffrage movement, and in Native American Civil Rights. Everyone wished Julie a safe and educational trip in June. She will tell us about her experiences at the Fall Gathering at Central Presbyterian Church in Waxahachie this October on the 19th. She will receive half of the offering at Covenant Presbyterian and half at Oak Cliff Presbyterian to help pay USAME for her trip.

We also had some Synod of the Sun officers attend the Oak Cliff workshop: Ruth Ann Camp, Search Committee Co-Moderator from First Presbyterian in Kilgore; Sally Judge, CCT Representative, from the Eastern Oklahoma Presbytery; and Pam Dotson,

Communications Coordinator, from First Presbyterian in Mabank. I also met the Churchwide Moderator for Hispanic Presbyterian Women who attends Oak Cliff Presbyterian Church. Her name is Ruth Roman-Meza. She gave me information about our four Hispanic churches in the Metroplex: Inglesia Emmanuel, El Divino Salvador, Gethsemane Presbyterian, and Bethany Presbyterian. I was glad to learn more about her work and her trip to Puerto Rico, which will be a Churchwide visit for PW Hispanic delegates this summer.

If you didn't make it to the workshops, you missed a relaxing time, a lot of information, and a chance to meet like-minded women from all over North Texas. We heard from Kathy Dodson at PCHAS and Nancylee Hadley at Rahab's Rope. We sang with Kathy Moriarty as she introduced old and new hymns from our Glory To God Hymnal. There were African Crafts for browsing and new information on Presbyterian Histories from Eva Riggs. We had a large amount of participants learn how to make large crocheted mats for homeless people with Pam Dotson. I hope this will excite you enough to visit the Fall Gathering in Waxahachie!



Two women from the PW at First Presbyterian Church attended the 2019 Gilmont Women's Retreat at Camp Gilmont. The theme was "The Pause" a time for relaxation and reflection. Tina Selvaggi and Bettina Zvanut participated in a weekend of prayer, meditation, singing, tai chi, yoga and hikes. Tina Selvaggi was also a presenter at three workshops where she educated and oversaw the attendees who wanted to experience the two labyrinths available for walking. Tina gave a talk on the history of labyrinths and used her own extensive knowledge of their structure to guide the group in drawing their own based on the design of the Chartres Cathedral.

Nearly fifty women attended the retreat from churches as far as Cleburne, Carrolton, and Arlington, and as close as Longview, Mt. Pleasant, and Athens. The headline speaker was Reverend Kate McGee who is pastor at Westminster Presbyterian church in Arlington, Texas. She presented studies on Hagar, Photine, and Mary throughout the two days; then she led the Sunday morning communion service in the Crain Center.

The weather was perfect, and everyone enjoyed the healthy food, beautiful scenery, and companionship with other Presbyterian women!

Together in Service Hands-on Project for children in Puerto Rico PW Pillowcases

Presbyterian Women can demonstrate their love, concern, and prayers for the children affected by Hurricane Maria in Puerto Rico. We are partnering with the three presbyteries on the island to create personalized pillowcases and distribute them through Presbyterian churches and schools. PW will send personalized pillowcases to the PW of the Synod of Puerto Rico in August 2019. We are hoping for at least 100! How can you help?

Create a special pillowcase for a child. Be creative!

Purchase a "blank" pillowcase and ...

Create a pattern with fabric paint, stamps, or dip-dyes; Glue or stitch on embroidery, buttons, felt, or ribbons to make a picture; Use iron-on appliques; Stitch on lace borders or a crocheted edging

Or make your own pillowcases! Sew, quilt, crochet or knit a whole pillowcase with fun colors Choose child-friendly designs; skilled sewers can make them reversible!

Be sure to include a message

Write a note telling a child in Puerto Rico that you are sending love and care with the pillowcase;

Send a prayer or special bible verse; Send a picture of yourself, church or PW group Sew in a label that identifies the group or shares a word of hope (perhaps in Spanish)

Make it an intergenerational project

Invite a young person to decorate a pillowcase with you Use the time to teach a new hands-on skill Talk about the importance of mission while you're working



Instead of creating a pillowcase, you may choose to donate craft supplies

During the Presbyterian Youth Triennium in July 2019, we will use the PW exhibit space to create pillowcases. We need supplies such as: Pillowcases; Fabric glue and appliques Fabric markers, stamps

Bible study 2019-2020:

Tell the truth, now: When you hear "The Ten Commandments," what's the first thing that comes to mind? Charlton Heston? Court battles over whether we can display them in public-school classrooms? For the coming year, the first thing on your mind should be "Presbyterian Women"!

The 2019-20 Bible Study, by Eugenia Gamble, is called "Love Carved in Stone: A Fresh Look at the Ten Commandments." Come to this workshop and get introduced to the study, as well as suggestions for other resources "for further study": Bible studies, other spiritual/religious resources, even relevant "nonreligious" nonfiction and fiction.



Spring Workshop "Light In The Gap"

We heard the inspirational message of a group of church women who minister to women released from prison in Texas, often getting off the prison van in men's clothes (although that is changing) with their few possessions in a net sack. Light In the Gap ministers with Snack Packs and Hygiene Kits as they board their busses in Waco's bus station. If you wish to help, items needed are: individual size trail mix, crackers (cheese/peanut butter), cookies, raisins, granola bars, mints/gun, beef jerky, breakfast bars, small water bottles, homemade cookies (NO peanut cookies). Also travel sized shampoo and conditioner, hand lotion/hand sanitizer, toothpaste, toothbrushes, fun socks/ fuzzy, band-Aids, face wipes, deodorant, small combs, small hair brushes, chapstick, safety



razors, tissues (small packs). These items can be brought to Fall Gathering in October or sent to Central Presbyterian Church, 9191 Woodway Dr., Waco, TX 76712 and we will forward them.

2019 PW Synod of the Sun Gathering Tulsa, OK - July 25-27 Special projects

Emergency Infant Services is a non-profit organization providing help for children 5 years and under in the Tulsa area, assisting over 18,000 infants and toddlers each year. (https://www.eistulsa.org/)

- 1. Layette supplies (one of each for each bag): *sleeper* and onesie (newborn for preemie layettes and 0-3 mo. for newborn layettes), pair of booties, fleece blanket, receiving blanket, baby wash, bottle, bulb syringe, pacifier, thermometer, and new reusable shopping bag to put supplies in.
- 2. Art kit: drawing paper, construction paper, markers, coloring and activity books, glue stick, and stickers.

Inverness Village is a non-profit retirement community with a Memory Support Unit in Tulsa. (https:// www.invernessvillage.com/health-services/memorysupport/)

Fidget mats and aprons for Alzheimer's patients: Goal is to make 12 mats or aprons for the Memory Support unit at Inverness Village in Tulsa; extra mats/aprons may be taken home by Gathering participants for patients in their communities. Fabric placemats; scraps of fabric, cuffs to button and unbutton, ribbon, lace, buttons, knitted flowers or other knitted objects, men's ties, bows, zippers, shoelaces and other tactical odds and ends that can be hand-sewn or glued to the mats/aprons
